
AFRICAN SWINE FEVER


DNA virus (Asfarviridae)

Only infects Suidae:
Domestic pigs
Wild boar
Warthog

Not a zoonosis







THE EPIDEMIOLOGY OF ASF

Transmission of virus through:

- direct or indirect contact with excreta (blood, faeces, urine, saliva, semen)
- feeding on carcasses / swill feeding
- ticks / flies

Very persistant virus Inactivated by desinfection

There is no good vaccine!

WHAT IS BIOSECURITY?

BIOSECURITY

The combination of all measures taken to reduce the risk of **introduction** and **spread** of diseases on herd, region, country,... level








EXTERNAL BIOSECURITY

= reduce introduction

INTERNAL BIOSECURITY

= reduce spread








WHY BIOSECURITY?

BIOSECURITY is (should be) the basis of any disease control program










1. Separation of infected and diseased animals

Direct contact








1. Separation of infected and diseased animals

Indirect contact







CLEAN (susceptible animals)




DIRTY
(direct and indirect sources of infection)

Dependent upon herd situation (status, type,...)
Perform well and consequent





2. Not every measure is equally important







3. Reduction of the infection pressure

→ Breaking the infection cycle, reducing the burden on the immune system







4. Size does matter









5. Frequency does matter

'Thousand times a small chance becomes a large chance'

Risk transmission route (p) Frequency transmission route (n)

$$P = 1 - (1-p)^n$$






1. Avoid buying in animals as much as possible.

If you do have to buy animals make absolutely sure they come from a save source.

PURCHASE OF SEMEN









- 1. Avoid buying in animals as much as possible.
- 2. Limit the number of visitors in the stables to the absolute minimum and register every visit. Take for every visitor (including yourself) at least the following measures:
 - Use cleaned and disinfected farm specific boots.
 - Use clean and farm specific clothes or coverall.
 - Wash your hands before entry.

- 1. Avoid buying in animals as much as possible.
- 2. Limit the number of visitors in the stables to the absolute minimum and register every visit.
- 3. Be very careful for every transport of animals and goods.
 - Make sure trucks for removal of pigs are always empty an thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
 - Keep trucks with feed and goods as far away from the stables as possible.
 - Make sure truck drivers have no access to the stables.

DISPOSAL OF ANIMALS AND MATERIAL









- 1. Avoid buying in animals as much as possible.

- 4. When you live in a region with wild boar make sure your **farm is well fenced** to assure that the wild board cannot approach the stables or feed storage places.


